In this article I want to share with you three aspects of the life and work of Falmouth and Penryn Churches Together which need your prayer and support .

The first aspect to mention is Mission. You may be aware that we have had four ecumenical missions in Falmouth in the past couple of years. The next mission will be held on Saturday 16<sup>th</sup> November. This is an opportunity for people to share their faith with others. The team who share faith will be supported by prayer partners. Please let me know if you would like to be part of the mission team or prayer support team.

The second aspect of the work of Churches Together is administration. You may be aware that the work of Churches Together has grown over the years. There is now a need to appoint an administrator to facilitate the work. The target to raise is £6,000 per annum. Some of this will be raised from grants and the rest will be achieved through the generosity of Church members in Falmouth and Penryn. If you can make a donation to support this project please let me know and I will put you in touch with the treasurer. This is a really important aspect of the future work and mission of our local Churches Together.

A third aspect of the work of Churches Together is a study morning on Climate change. This will be held at Emmanuel Baptist Church on Saturday 12<sup>th</sup> October commencing at 10.00am until lunchtime. There will be a theological presentation on climate issues and experts will give their views on the subject. This is an open meeting and we welcome you to attend and learn more on this important topic which affects us and future generations.
